Dear Church Family,

Each of you who make up the Acacia Park family consistently amaze me. I was gone for two weeks visiting family in the Northwest, and when I came back, I found a transformed church. The space has been rearranged to welcome and create space for New Life. I learned about life events that caused personal change either by starting school, medical information shared, or the death of a loved one or a pet. And I was welcomed back to dozens of emails about things that keep a church running and upcoming meetings. That's what happens with a family. People take care of each other, and life continues to move forward even if pieces of the family are missing or there are so many changes that life begins to feel a little unrecognizable.

It may feel that way in the building right now. We are easing into sharing space with New Life, and furniture is being moved around. Additionally, our worship space has new speakers and a sound board in the back; the lounge area has been moved to one of the classrooms on the first floor in the education wing; and there are likely a few other changes that you have noticed here and there. We all know change is rough, and adapting to new situations takes time. But it can also be exciting, and we can learn from the new experiences.

For the past year the council worked on creating a partnership with New Life through meetings and contracts. A Space Sharing Committee met a few times to talk about all of our partnerships and to try to anticipate any rough patches before they happen. This month the council will reach out to people to join a Review Committee. This team will meet with members of New Life to talk about relationship building and address any concerns that may come up as we learn to share space together. Once this committee is formed the information of who is serving on the team will be shared. If you feel called to serve on the committee, please speak with Karen Lanners before the council meeting on September 19th when the council will be discussing possible members for the team.

If you have any questions or concerns about sharing space or if you would like clarification on something you are not quite sure about, please know that the members of the Space Sharing Committee are available to speak with you: Tony Valentino, Marion Engler, Patti Mann, and Karen Lanners. I am always open to a conversation, but if you would rather remain anonymous, you can write your concern or question out and place it in the suggestion box which gets checked on Sunday after worship.

On **Sunday, September 9th**, worship service returns upstairs to the Sanctuary.


CHILDREN'S FAITH FORMATION

Sending Out Our Thanks

Thank you to everyone who attended and/or volunteered for our pancake brunch fundraiser on August 5th. We raised close to \$1,200, kicking off our **Raising the Roof and Opening the Doors** Capital Campaign to help replace the roof and the front doors of the church.

During the brunch, we served approximately 80 people. We used 13 pounds of pancake mix, which made about 325 pancakes, and we cooked and served 250 sausages. We had a variety of fruit available including berries, melons, bananas, cherries and clementines. Our guests drank three gallons of orange juice, a gallon of milk, a 1/2 gallon of lemonade and close to



100 cups of coffee. Additionally, guests were treated to cookies, coffee cake, cupcakes and a delicious chocolate sheet cake to welcome our six new members of the congregation: Patti, Bobby and Katie Dupree, Linda Jenkins, Elsie Michelsen and Wanda Nagel. Everyone had plenty to eat.

We also celebrated Ruth Igoe's 88th birthday with a resounding chorus of Happy Birthday!

We finished up with a raffle drawing for some great prizes including Amazon gift cards, Mariano's gift cards, and dining gift cards to a number of excellent restaurants in our area. Our 50/50 raffle was the final drawing of the day and saw the winner, Per Lynnerup, give his half of the pot to Acacia Park and to Save the District 80 Band. 
